”DESIGN YOUR OWN LOGO”


In recognition of National Peanut Butter Day, the students designed their own peanut butter logo. The painting activity promotes entrepreneurship, creativity, and relieved stress.







SHORT STORY BOOK

The students were given the opportunity to use their imagination and express their creative side through their short story books.






NATIONAL ANTHEM DAY


VISIT FROM THE HUMANE SOCIETY


ART FOR CSV RESIDENTS
